He won a scholarship to Chouinard where he studied illustration and advertising design. During the emergence of hippies and counterculture art, Dayton's posters such as "Quack" and "Now" came to be highly collected from 1967 to 1973 and were featured on the cover and lead article about the psychedelic art phenomenon in Life Magazine. His posters can also be seen in various films and documentaries of the hippie and Haight-Ashbury era. Dayton eventually founded his own studio called, ArtiFact Ink. He has been selected multiple times for juried design and illustration competitions and his last Society of Illustrators LA selection was chosen for display in the gallery show of the best of "Illustration West."
